

What will camp be like in 2022?

We are excited to be opening Camp in 2022 and having your family join us. We are happy to say that we will be able to relax many of the COVID restrictions we had to follow in 2020 and 2021. That being said, we will still not be back to a full Cedar Lodge format, but we believe the programming we have come up with is an adequate hybrid. There will be changes, and we are determined to try and run without wrecking your fun!

There are two different groups at Cedar Lodge in 2022: Overnight campers and Day/Mini-Me Campers. They will be handled slightly differently.

Overnight Campers: If you read the Parent's guide, you already know that the Sunday you come to camp will be different than normal, but similar to 2021. We will be meeting you at your car when you arrive, and parents will need to say good bye to you before we take you and your luggage up to the cabin. It's a very traditional format for camps, and it just so happens that it is a safer way to run camps after a pandemic. Your temperature will be taken and we plan to have a nasal swab test administered on your arrival. This is easier than the test that you receive before you come to camp, but also less accurate. One test will not negate the need for the other. You will be assigned a cabin group with other campers close to your age. You will sit with your cabin at meals, and many activities during the day might be together. There will be times (like riding and vaulting) that you will branch away from your cabin to do other things. You also may chose to do other activities offered daily away from your cabin group and that's totally ok.

Day Camp and Mini-Me: Much like the overnight campers, day camp will be handled differently for 2022. As you read in the drop off/pick up directions on another link, we will be meeting Day Campers and Mini Me at the flag pole outside of the camp dining hall. They will be met by a camp official or a day camp counselor. Mini-Mes and Day campers will form their own cabin group for meals, rest hour and and inside time. Younger Day campers will be structured into activities. Older Day campers will be allowed more freedom to choose activities. Each day when they arrive in the morning for camp, their temperatures will be taken and they will have a nasal swab test (easier than the one done before camp).
